ABOUT COLLEGE

Govt. WAY TO COLLEGE

Wadrafnagar administrative block of District Balrampur (CG) India and situated very close to border of Jharkhand, Uttar Pradesh and Madhya Pradesh state of India. The border of Wadrafnagar tehsil is bounded by Garhwa district of Jharkhand state in the north east direction, Renukoot town of Sonbhadra district of U.P. state in the north direction and Singrauli district of M.P. state in the north-west direction. Distance of wadrafnagar tehsil from some major places are as follow : Raipur C.G. 426km, Bilaspur C.G. 308km, Renukoot UP 77km, Varanashi UP 220km, Garhwa Jharkhand 119km, Singrauli MP 107km, Waidhan MP 85km.
